



2016 - 2017 RULES

The Junior Circuit has been formed to reward the youth involved in beef, sheep, swine and market goat projects.

Points will be kept by the SAILA office and all questions regarding the circuit should be directed toward the SAILA office.

JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP GUIDELINES

General Rules

The 2016-2017 SAILA Junior Show Circuit program will award points to SAILA Junior Members who have competed in approved shows, beginning with the March 13, 2016 Junior Livestock Show.

Points will be awarded at **all SAILA Field Days and all SAILA Sanctioned Shows that are open to the entire state.** Additional shows meeting criteria determined by the SAILA Board of Directors, may also become pointed shows. Exhibitors will have points accumulated based on 80% of the total available SAILA & SAILA Sanctioned shows in a show year.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS AWARDS WILL BE PRESENTED IN THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

BEEF

1. Jr. Showmanship
2. Sr. Showmanship
3. Market Beef
4. Breeding Heifers

SWINE

1. Jr. Showmanship
2. Sr. Showmanship
3. Market Swine
4. Breeding Gilts

SHEEP

1. Jr. Showmanship
2. Sr. Showmanship
3. Market Lambs
4. Breeding Sheep

MARKET GOATS

1. Jr. Showmanship
2. Sr. Showmanship
3. Market Goats
4. Breeding Goats

QUIZ BOWL

1. Junior
2. Senior

QUALIFIED EXHIBITORS

All youth who want to participate in the SAILA Junior Show Circuit may do so by:

1. Becoming a SAILA Junior Member.

Points will NOT be tabulated until the full amount is paid so it is highly recommended to pay the membership at or prior to the first show.

2. If an exhibitor wishes to show in only one local SAILA Field Day, they can do so by paying a one-time set by SAILA (in addition to entry fees) in lieu of becoming a SAILA Junior member.

3. Exhibitors must show their own animals, however there are times when this is not possible, i.e. having two animals in the same class. In this case, the exhibitor owning the animal will receive the appropriate points. If an exhibitor enters a show they must be present and show their own animals.

4. All showmanship exhibitors must show an animal that they exhibited in the breeding or market division. Exception: PeeWee Showmanship

5. No exhibitor shall be eligible for entry or participation in SAILA or SAILA sanctioned shows when the Exhibitor now or previously, has been deemed ineligible for entry, participation or attendance due to entry, rule, ethical violations or violations of the National Code of Show Ring Ethics, by SAILA, another State Fair, County Fair or recognized livestock show.

If any exhibitors Parent(s)/Guardian(s) or Responsible Party have been deemed ineligible for entry, participation or attendance due to entry, rule, ethical violations or violations of the National Code of Show Ring Ethics, by SAILA, another State Fair, County Fair or recognized livestock show then that exhibitor is ineligible for entry, participation or attendance in any SAILA or SAILA sanctioned shows as well. Once a exhibitor has reached the legal age of 18 then that exhibitor may enter on their own behalf.

Anyone deemed ineligible from SAILA, a State Fair, County Fair or recognized livestock show shall not be permitted to attend or be in attendance at any SAILA or SAILA sanctioned livestock show or event regardless of location or sponsor.

6. Animals are NOT to be shown in more than one division at any given show. ie - a ewe lamb may not be shown as a breeding sheep and as a market lamb.

7. SAILA reserves the right to request and scan/copy and keep record of any Credentials/Entry Forms, Federal or State Permits/Passes/Inspections/Paperwork at any time on any animal that entry is being requested at/for a SAILA or SAILA Sanctioned show.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR

These awards are presented to the Junior and Senior that are the highest ranking individual in three categories, i.e. market, breeding, showmanship and the Quiz Bowl. This award may only be won once within an age division.

ALL AROUND EXHIBITORS

To be eligible, exhibitors must show at least two species in four different categories, i.e. having a market steer, and showing in beef showmanship, and having a breeding swine, and showing in swine showmanship. The Quiz Bowl will also count as a category. A maximum of two divisions per species will be counted. The All Around winner will be determined by the ranking within each category, rather than a total amount of points. There will only be one All Around Award given per year

SAILA JUNIOR PRIVILEGES

The Junior member will receive all SAILA mailings, newsletters, and membership insignia. Juniors can attend all membership functions and Open Board meetings, and have all privileges except the right to vote.

JUNIOR MEMBERS MUST:

A. Junior Membership is open to the World

B. Be eight years old by the day of their first SAILA show *** Please Make Note Of This*******

C. Have not reached their 21st birthday by the first show of the SAILA Show year. *** Please Make Note of This *******

Beef Divisions

Market (1000 lbs & up)
Feeder (651 - 999 lbs)

Swine Divisions

Market (200 lbs & up)
Feeder (up to 199 lbs)

Market (100 lbs & up)

Showmanship

Goat Divisions

Market (70 lbs & up)
Feeder (35 to 69 lbs)
Breeding Bucks

Junior = not 14 years old by day of show

Senior = 14 or older by day of show

In the case of Breeding Heifers, Breeding Sheep, Breeding Goats and Breeding Gilts - animals must have registration papers or they will show in a Commercial Class.

If an exhibitor will become a Junior (i.e. become at least 8 years old by or on day of first show), they are eligible to compete. If an exhibitor will become a senior **during the SAILA Show year**, they are advised to show as a Senior in the Field Days, as their points will not change categories.

All livestock will be screened for health issues - this will include, but not be limited to: Sheep/goat fungus, Ringworm and Lice. If you question the status of your animal's health, PLEASE leave it at home.

Proof of ownership will NOT be required to show. SAILA recommends that all exhibitors follow the Arizona Department of Agriculture Seasonal Pass requirements for transportation. All out of state exhibitors should be in compliance with the Arizona Department of Agriculture Importation Regulations.

Breeding Divisions: For registered livestock, registration papers must indicate the exhibitor as the owner or the exhibitor must provide the registration papers accompanied with a lease agreement authorizing the exhibitor to show the animal. In the event the exhibitor fails to provide registrations papers and/or the lease agreement the entry will entered into the commercial class.

POINTS

Market & Breeding Classes:

Exhibitors will have points accumulated based on 80% of the total available SAILA & SAILA Sanctioned shows in a show year. - these will not be reflected on the point totals that are posted until the final show in March.

Points will be awarded as follows: the number of points for 1st place will be equal to the number of exhibitors in a particular class. Each subsequent exhibitor will receive one less point respectively. Ex. - In a class of 10, 1st place receives 10, 2nd receives 9, 3rd receives 8 and so on.

Champion Points:

Grand & Reserve Champions will receive Ten & Five Point respectively in the market and feeder divisions, as long as there are ten animals competing within that division - ie . 10 Steer Calves, etc.

In the event that the Champion or Reserve should come out of a class with fewer numbers than other classes within the division (i.e. Feeder Steers), the following will occur: The Champion will receive as many points as the highest placing animal in the largest class, plus the additional 10 points, with the Reserve Champion receiving 5 additional points. This will ensure that the animal deemed the most superior within a division will receive the most points.

Breed Champions:

Breed Champions and Reserves will receive Five & Three points respectively. The same rule as above will apply to breed champions. - Each Breed Champion will receive 5 more points, and the Reserve - 3 more points, than the rest of the animals with a particular breed.

Supreme Champions:

Supreme Champions and Reserves will receive Ten & Five points respectively. The same rule as above will apply with the Sup. & Res. Sup. receiving 10 and 5 more points respectively than the others competing in the Supreme Champion drives.

Showmanship:

Participation Points - All participants will receive two points. Exhibitor must show their own animal in showmanship.

Supreme Champion points will not be awarded if there are not 10 or more animals within the division. ie - 4 total rams in show - no additional points.

Showmanship:

Participation Points - All showmanship exhibitors must show an animal that they exhibited in the breeding or market division. If exhibitor is found violating the rule they will forfeit all points, awards, prizes and premiums.

Call Back Points:

Five points will be awarded to each exhibitor that is called back to a final round. There must be multiple lots of an age division before these points are awarded.

Final Drive Points:

First place will receive points equaling the number of exhibitors in the final round, plus their initial participation and call back points. Second will receive one point less, third place two points less than first, and so on. Points will be awarded in this manner for the final drive as far down as the judge places.
